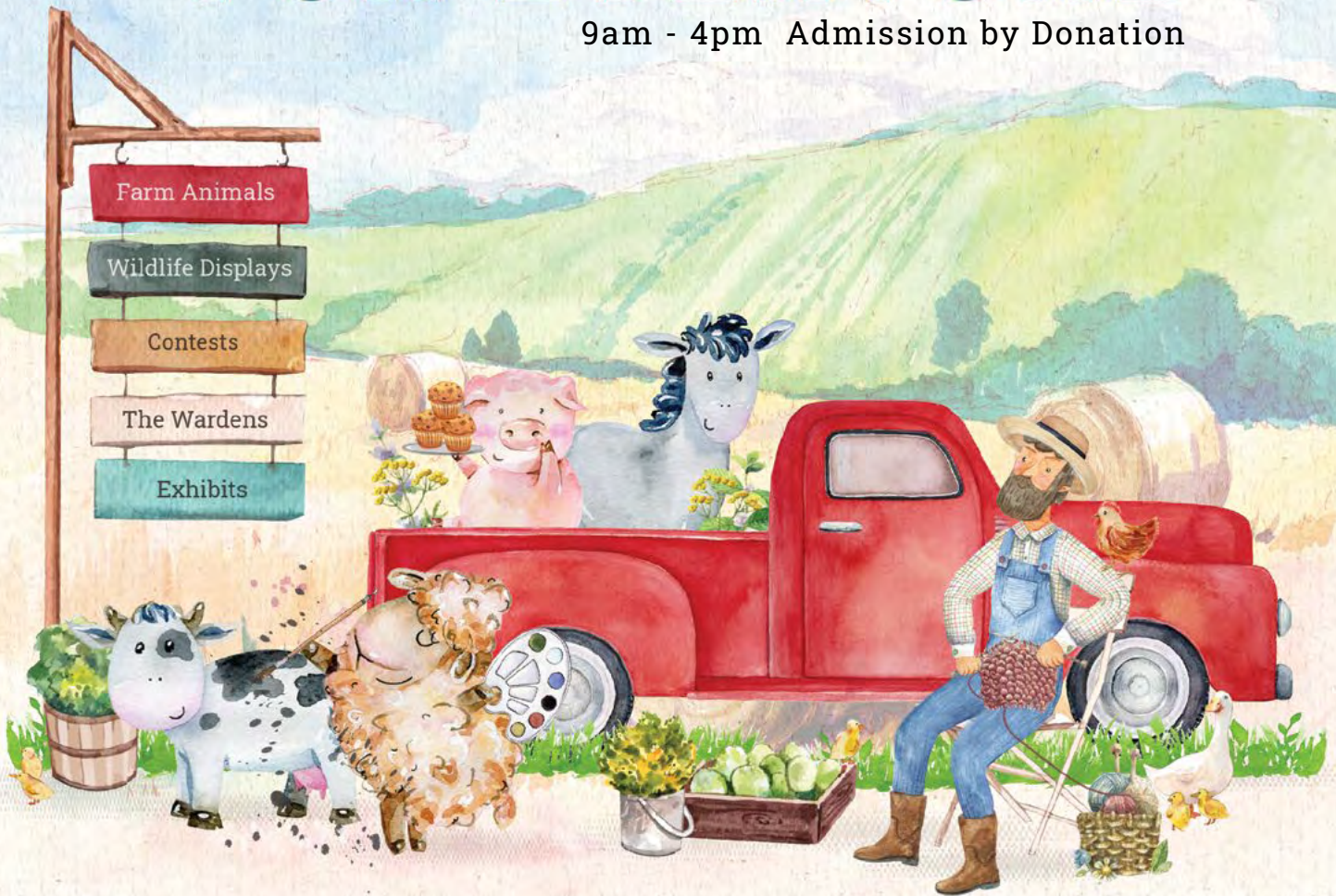

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INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS

ENTERING AN EXHIBIT

1. All exhibit classes are listed in the 2022 Priddis & Millarville Fair Book and online at primil.fairwire.com. Print copies of the Fair Book are available at the MRAS office starting June 1, 2022 or the electronic copy can be downloaded from the MRAS website also starting June 1, 2022.
2. Exhibitors can register using the entry forms at the back of the Fair Book and hand-delivering, emailing or mailing the forms to the MRAS office at any time up to the entry deadline OR register online at primil.fairwire.com commencing July 1, 2022.
3. Each exhibitor is charged a \$5.00 fee to register and each entry is charged a fee that is listed for each department. All entry forms and payments must be received no later than August 7, 2022.
4. Entry fees can be paid during online registration, by e-transfer to fair@millarvilleracetrack.com or by cheque, cash, credit or debit payment through the MRAS office.
5. No entry fees can be refunded.
6. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the Fair. Proof must be available if requested.
7. Age for junior exhibitors is as of January 1, 2022.
8. Junior exhibitors may enter in an age group higher but not lower than their own age.
9. Blank tags may be purchased for the Flower and Vegetable & Fruit Departments, adult and junior, only. They can be used for any class within these Departments. The exhibitor must fill in the class number and description on the tag when dropping their exhibit off for judging.

TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS

- Read the general Fair and department specific rules carefully. Any entry that does not comply with the rules may be disqualified for judging.
- Ensure your entries are clean, neat and presentable. Follow any instructions for presentation given in the Fair Book, including safety equipment.
- Various judging guidelines are used by the Fair and are listed on the MRAS website at www.millarvilleracetrack.com/priddis-millarville-fair/ under Judging Information.
- Make sure your exhibit arrives at the exhibit location on time for judging.
- Properly affix tags to each bench exhibit. Display or wear exhibitor tags for livestock and horse departments.
- Be open minded. You can't always win, but great satisfaction is derived from showing your work, skill or livestock.
- If you have questions or suggestions for improving the Fair experience, take the time to talk to the Fair organizers.

GENERAL FAIR RULES

FAIR WEEKEND

1. Bench exhibit departments - Arts & Handicrafts, Fibre Arts, Flowers, Home Cooking & Baking, Photography, Vegetables & Fruit and Woodworking - will be received, judged, displayed and picked up in the Arena at the Millarville Racetrack. The exhibitor is responsible for:
 - picking up an entry tag for each exhibit that identifies the exhibitor and the exhibit
 - securely attaching the tag to the exhibit
 - delivering the exhibit to the designated department area in the Arena for judging
 - picking up their entry after 4:00 p.m. on Fair Sunday.
2. Tags can be picked up and exhibits dropped off starting at 11:00 a.m. on Friday August 19, 2022. Exhibits must be in place by 5:00 p.m. for judging that evening.
3. All bench departments will be judged Friday evening, starting at 5:30 p.m.
4. Bench exhibits are to be picked up from the Arena between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Fair Sunday. No exhibits are to be removed from display before 4:00 p.m. The Fair Department Managers are not responsible for any articles left on the grounds or in facilities after 6:00 p.m. on Fair Sunday.
5. Poultry, Waterfowl & Pigeons will be judged and displayed in the Quonset. Tags will be affixed to the cages in judging order. Please place your bird in the appropriate cage. Birds must be in place and all vehicles removed from the market area by 8:00 a.m. Saturday. Judging begins at 10:00 a.m. Saturday. Birds are to remain in place until 4:00 p.m. Sunday.
6. Equestrian exhibitors will be supplied with an identification number to be worn on their backs on the day of the show.
7. Beef Cattle, Sheep, Dairy Goats and Horse Costume exhibitors will be given identification numbers at ringside on the day of the show.
8. No animal suffering from a contagious or infectious disease will be allowed on the MRAS grounds.
9. Fair volunteers are not responsible for damage to or theft of the exhibits.
10. The sale of exhibits is not allowed on the Fair grounds unless exceptions are specified.

JUDGING

1. The Judges shall act with impartiality and in compliance with judging standards set by Department Managers or standards set out for sanctioned shows as detailed in each relevant department.
2. Further information on judging methodology can be found on the MRAS website at www.millarvilleracetrack.com/priddis-millarville-fair.
3. The Fair Committee and Judges are bound by the rules of the Fair.
4. The Judge has the authority to move an exhibit between classes if the judge deems it to be in the incorrect class.
5. Any award granted will be at the discretion of the Judge.

PRIZES

1. Each class, unless otherwise noted in the rules for each department, has a cash prize payout for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. The amount paid is noted with each department.
2. In addition to the class cash prize, some departments offer special cash and/or merchandise prizes as detailed in each department section of the Fair Book.
3. For participating departments, an Award of Excellence rosette will be given for the best exhibit in that department, as selected by the Judge(s) in that department.
4. Prize money will be paid in early September via e-transfer or cheque. The Fair will gratefully accept any winnings as a donation to the Fair.

This competition provides an opportunity for animal caretakers to showcase the artistic endeavours of their critters: cattle, sheep, goats, horses and other four-legged creatures requiring the nutritional supplements of salt/mineral blocks. As the caretakers travel throughout their pastures, this comment is often heard "Hey, did you get a look at that salt block?" Hence, the creation of "pasture art". Judging criteria is based on the two words: "pasture" and "art".

RULES

1. All entries must be salt blocks licked by cows or other livestock.
Wild critter (deer, elk, moose etc.) assistance is permitted and/or encouraged.
2. Human enhancement may result in massive loss of credibility.
3. Entries must be presented in "pasture" condition as judges look for this evidence.

ROOSTER CROWING COMPETITION

Can your rooster out-crow any other rooster? Let's find out!

Distinguished Judge – Bill Jackson

Name of 1st place winner engraved on the World Champion Rooster Crowing trophy, donated by Bill Jackson

Entry Fee: No fee to enter but the bird must be registered in one of the Chicken divisions in the Poultry, Waterfowl and Pigeons Department. No pre-registration needed for the rooster crowing competition.

Prize Payouts: \$2 per crow per rooster

RULES

1. Competition will run on Saturday and Sunday at 9:30 a.m. outside the arena south entrance.
2. Birds must be in the crowing competition cages by 9:20 a.m. and returned to the appropriate cage in the Quonset to ensure they are ready for judging in the Poultry, Waterfowl and Pigeons department that starts at 10:00 a.m.
3. Competition is timed and each crow during the time interval allowed will be awarded \$2. All cash awards will be given to the rooster's handler at the conclusion of the competition.



PIE EATING COMPETITION

Entry Fee: \$5.00 per team of 3 people (Eater, Feeder, Director) | Prize Payouts: 1st \$45, 2nd \$30, 3rd \$15 per team
Pre-registration is not required.

RULES

1. Registration opens 30 minutes before the competition begins. Check the daily Fair schedule for time and location of competition. Number of teams is determined by the number of pies available, so be quick.
2. Eater and Feeder are blindfolded. The Eater must keep their hands behind their back. The Feeder uses a spoon to deliver the pie to the Eater.
3. The Director is not blindfolded and directs the Feeder.
4. No hand feeding, the Feeder must use the spoon provided.
5. No throwing pie on the ground.
6. The competition is over when the first, second and third pie plates are empty.
7. No age limits!



WATERMELON EATING COMPETITION

Entry Fee: \$5.00 per team of 2 people (Eater, Feeder) | Prize Payouts: 1st \$30, 2nd \$20, 3rd \$10 per team
Pre-registration is not required.

RULES

1. Registration opens 30 minutes before the competition begins. Check the daily Fair schedule for time and location of competition. Number of teams is determined by the number of watermelons available, so be quick.
2. The Eater must keep their hands behind their back. The Feeder holds the watermelon for the Eater.
3. No spitting watermelon on the ground.
4. The competition is over when the first, second and third watermelons are eaten to the rind.
5. No age limits!

Use the Light Horse entry form at the back of this book or register online at primil.fairwire.com. Include the name of the horse for each entry. Start time: 8:00 a.m. sharp at the Rodeo Infield Fair Saturday for flat classes. Jumping classes will be held in the Sand Ring following the flat classes. Packages with competitor numbers & classes can be collected on Saturday morning at the registration desk, north end of the Sand Ring. **PLEASE arrive at the Racetrack grounds no later than 7:00 a.m. due to traffic congestion after this time. Parking attendants will be onsite.**

RULES

1. Only one rider per horse.
2. Appropriate English equipment, tack and attire shall be used in all events. All competitors must wear a properly fitted, approved helmet with safety strap permanently affixed to the helmet and boots with heels.
3. Riders may ride in a higher age group but not lower and must be consistent throughout the day.
4. Competitors may enter in a maximum of three consecutive height divisions for over fence classes.
5. Classes with less than four entries may be cancelled.
6. Jumping classes will be one round.
7. No Stallions allowed.
8. Riders not at ringside when called for their class will forfeit that ride.

NOTES:

- Equitation over fences: Judged on how riders are positioned and how effective they are in using their aids when completing a course over fences.
- Match the clock (optimum time): Competitors with equal jumping faults will be placed according to how close their time is to the optimum time, based on the course being ridden at the posted speed.
- Gamblers Choice: Obstacles on the course have different point values. Time is fixed. Competitors can jump any obstacle in any order / direction. After the time has elapsed, competitors can "gamble" and attempt the "joker" +200 if clear, -200 if refused or knocked down. High score wins.
- Novice "Just Do It" classes (new for 2022) - Open to First Timers and those returning to the show scene after many years. Now is the time, let's get into or back to the Show Ring.

2. Exhibitors are encouraged to refer to "Alberta Agriculture Judging & Exhibiting Standards for Horticultural Shows" on the Fair website: millarvilleracetrack.com/priddis-millarville-fair. These standards will be used by the judges and include directions for quantities and display.
3. Entries which do not conform to specifications in the class description will not be judged.
4. Please include the name of the fruit or vegetable variety for your exhibit if possible.
5. Exhibitors may enter two exhibits in the same class if they are of different varieties. If entering a second variety, the name of the variety should be given for both entries.
6. If there are three or more entries of one variety in a class, that variety will be judged separately.
7. All entries must be locally grown.
8. If you selected the class Blank Tag, you must complete all the information on the exhibit tag before submitting it for judging.

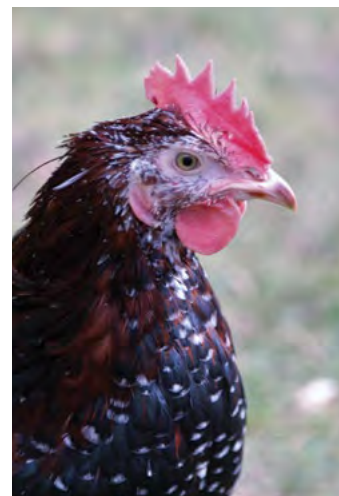
