

MILLARVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Honors Black History Month TOM SPENCER 1841 - 1925

We all know about John Ware, but we had two colored gentlemen in Millarville and the other one was Tom Spencer. He took up a homestead one mile west of Joe Fisher on SW1-21-4-W5. Tom had come from Oklahoma and never forgot his homeland. His favorite expression was "Ah'm going back to Oklahoma next year" but that never came, and he spent the remainder of his life in the hills. He was a popular homesteader in the Kew area.

Tom loved to visit the ranchers and entertained his hosts with tales of his childhood but said little about his adult life. Tom had been born a slave and had scars on his back to prove it. His mother also had been a slave and he told my mother of the cruel beatings she had suffered.

Old Tom was not a bronc rider as John Ware had been and rode only the gentlest of horses. This horse was a long-legged black with a very odd gait that made it easy to identify him in the distance.


Children loved this gentle old man with his stories and sometimes a little gift. At that time playthings were not too plentiful, and a ball or cup was as good as a bejewelled crown. He was not above giving a lecture to young-ins when they talked back to their elders.

The first person that Tom saw when he got off the train in Calgary was Sid Bannerman. He asked where a colored man could get a room. Sid told him to try the Riverside Hotel where he indeed did get a room. Years later when Tom lay extremely ill in an old log shack near Sid's ranch at Kew he was visited daily by Sid. The homestead was sold to Jim Howey (of Howey Hill fame) when Tom died with Sid sitting by him. By Sid's calculations Tom was 84 years old when he died in 1925.


