There is a lot of flexibility here to add whatever you'd like for your Mother's Day Charcuterie Board! You can fill in the letters with fruits, veggies, cheese, sweets, or any snacks.

- Grapes
- Kiwi
- Strawberries
- Blueberries
- Salami
- Cheese
- Crackers
- Nuts
- Chocolate-covered pretzels
- Chocolate-covered almonds
- Cherry tomatoes, Mozzarella balls, and pickle spears
- Flowers (for garnish)
- M-O-M letters (you can find these at most craft stores such as Michaels, or on Amazon.) or click <u>HERE</u> to make your own.
- Liner for the letters, such as parchment paper, wax paper, paper towels, cupcake liners or napkins

Directions

- 1. Clean out the letters using a paper towel. You can line the letters with napkins, cupcake liners or paper towels, or trace the letters onto wax paper or parchment paper, then cut out to line them.
- 2. Start arranging the snacks: I always recommend starting with the largest items and finishing with the smallest items to fill in any bare areas in your Mother's Day Charcuterie Board.
- 3. Decorate with flowers or leaves.

The MRAS riding rules, and sign-up sheet have been developed to help our members have a safe and enjoyable time riding while also maintaining our building in good condition.

<u>Riding Rules:</u> These have been created and agreed upon to ensure everyone using the facility remains safe and that our facility can be kept in great condition. <u>Booking Sheet:</u> Please use the booking sheet when you plan to ride and honor your time. This practice is in place to ensure fair usage of the facility and helps the maintenance team and myself plan when we can be in the arena for maintenance.

<u>Manure:</u> Please continue to clean up after your horses. I know the vast majority of you are excellent at this, but it continues to be a problem.

<u>NEW PROCESS</u>

Remove your horse's manure from the arena using the <u>forks and pails</u> and transport it to the blue bins. <u>Pails</u> should not be used for storage of manure; it belongs in the blue bins.



BIG HORN RANGER STATION Submitted by Gene Blakley – Millarville Historical Society

In 1907, the Bow River Forest Reserve boundary was set bordering the Kew district in Townships 20 and 21. The site for the ranger stations was on the South Fork of Sheep Creek. Harry Holness had squatter's rights on the land, so the government bought his interest and he moved away.

The first ranger was Mr. Brown and his wife, and they lived there for some time. He was followed by Mr. Greenfield and Bill Foran. Bill Ward was Bill's assistant, and he built the first cabin on the North Fork and lived with his wife there.

In 1915 a telephone line was put in between the Elbow, North Fork and Big Horn Stations. Fred Edger and Si Burroughs ran the wire, and this helped to keep the rangers in contact.

In 1918, grass was becoming very scarce in the foothills with so much land being taken by homesteaders. This was solved by forming the North and South Fork Stock Associations so the ranchers could acquire grazing leases in the Forestry lands. Some of these permits have been in the same family for over 90 years. At first there were more horse herds than cattle. The rangers had the job of keeping tab on the stock, but Bob Carry and later Tip Johnson and Alec Murdock were range riders in the South Fork and the ranchers did their own on the North Fork.

After Bill Forn retired, Mr. Fowler and then Henry Howey took over in 1920 and stayed for ten years. The first road to the North Fork Station was built in 1921 from George Silvester's ranch to the cabin which was just above the North Fork Campground now. In the late 1920's, a new log house was built at the South Fork by Mr. Fitzsimmons. When completed, Henry Howey gave a grand housewarming attended by ranchers from miles around. A Chinook had made the road around Windy Point icy and very dangerous, so the afternoon before the party Bob Carry cut a rut on the outer edge of the road to keep anyone from sliding over the edge and down the steep bank to the river below. However, a snowstorm that evening undid Bob's work, making conditions very hazardous. The party lasted until daylight, and the following morning on their way home many ladies decided to walk around the Point. In 1929, Fred Nash came from the Highwood to take over and his wife and two daughters stayed for eighteen years until he retired in 1947. Jack Butler was followed by Bill Balmer, Ray Mustard and Joe Macovic and new buildings were built at the South Fork. Some of the assistants over the years were: John L'Hirondelle, Lloyd Weikle, Mac Mackenzie, Bob Fathergill, Lee Smiley, Jack Bird, Ron Steeves, Alec Fraser, Irving Frew, Buck Belanger, Bob Fletcher, Bill Jarvis, Jack Mickle, Murray Meister, Charlie Clark, Kilmeister, Leonard Kennedy and Joe Burritt. Some of the Lookout Men were George Orbie, Charlie Waldon, Murray Meister, Milly Raymond, and Curley Sand.

The years have seen many changes and the rangers were moved out of the district to become town dwellers. With no residents, the barns and houses have been removed but the Big Horn Sheep still roam the hills near the old building site. The contributions of the men and women that inhabited these remote stations can never be forgotten as they kept the districts the same as a rancher keeps his land, safe and productive. In my opinion, I believe we were better served by having these families in the area than making them commute to work from the small towns some distance away. But that is not the object of this article - it is to honor the families that did a hard job for small pay and gave us these beautiful areas to hike, ride or just drive through to enjoy.


