MILLARVILLE AND DISTRICT RECREATION BOARD



MILLARVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

STONEY HISTORY IN MILLARVILLE

The Stonies called it "tôshû'barh'a ízû'bî" meaning a bunch of tipi poles that formed a cache to be used, left, and used on their return. This was a favorite camping spot on their way south to the summer hunting grounds.

Before there were any settlers in Millarville and Kew districts the Stoney had a trail along the foothills from their home near the Bow River to their hunting grounds in the Sheep and Highwood River country. It ran down approximately where highway 762 runs today and it was so boggy in places that it would bog down a snip. But the Stoney knew where to travel, and they made this trek annually. It is known as the Morley Trail.

After the ranchers came, they looked forward to this annual migration, knowing that with the Stoney came spring. What a colorful sight it was when the long column came into view. Light wagons carrying the older people and small children, and many riders, some of these young girls with their full skirts draped over the pony's sides and often a papoose riding in a moss bag on her back.

One favorite camping grounds was at the forks of the Sheep and Fisher Creek. Here many teepees were set up. This was used as a base as they went to trade goods and look for work. A lot of trading went on, some at the old Millarville Trading Post. As many as twenty of thirty with their long braids, would be squatted around the pot-bellied stove. Mrs. Millar would give them meat, bread, butter, jam, and tea to eat and would sell Malcolm Millar, what pelts of skins they accumulated. Each had their own account and did not pay cash but in due course it was paid with pelts and skins.

When the saskatoons and other berries were ready to be picked, the women would arrive at the ranch houses with as many berries that they had containers to carry them to trade. There were the Dixons, Powderfaces, Riders, Ear, Dogtail, Roll-in-the-Mud and many others.

The Stoney band bought the Eden Valley Ranch in 1958 and became part of the Stoney First Nation.

Much visiting is done between there and Morley, only now travelling by car on much better roads than their grandparents did so long ago.

Mrs. Basilici and her daughters lived on the Morley trail and were good friends of the David Bearspaw family.


My aunt, Jane Basilici Fisher, told me one time that he loved to listen to the phonograph that Elizabeth had. He would sit and listen to the old Italian Opera singers. So, when Mrs. David Bearspaw, passed on October 6, 1968, Elizabeth von Rummel went to Morley for the services of this 106-year-old lady. She said it was very impressive with a beautiful chant by John Powderface and Frank Powderface speaking in Stoney. The preacher was Tom Snow. The little church was full of people, a few whites, and many children. Then we went to the cemetery which was on a side hill. The view so lovely, brown hills and below the Bow River. The cemetery in deep grass with wooden crosses sticking out. Everybody stood in a circle; again, the old man sang.

Elizabeth was glad she went to represent the Rodger's, Fisher's and Blakley's.

"It was so sincere and real."

I am sharing this letter to show the connection that was here in Millarville, Priddis and Bragg Creek. No tale of Millarville would be complete without acknowledging the Stoney.

Below is one of the favorite visitors to the homes along the Morley Trail - a man whose appearance seems to typify early Millarville to many. A man who was kind to children but feared dogs and would not get off his horse until someone caught the dog.

<u>Riding Rules:</u> These have been created and agreed upon to ensure everyone using the facility remains safe and that our facility can be kept in great condition. 
