Ride a Test Clinic Judge: Kimberly Cox

Would you like some feedback on your horse and rider communication? Are you competing in a show this summer? Wondering how to improve your riding of a dressage test?? If yes to any of these questions, we invite you to join us for this dressage show practice opportunity.

Any dressage test can be ridden. English dressage (<u>www.equestrian.ca</u>), western dressage (<u>www.wdaa.org</u>) or working equitation (WE) dressage (<u>www.workingeq.ca</u>) test (note: only one WE test per competition level).

Each group of 3 riders will have time for a warmup, then into a mock show experience. Each rider will be called into the dressage ring for their individual test. Two tests per rider; choose your favorite two from your level. Bring your game face, show apparel and show off what you know. If you require (and, per the test, are allowed) a reader, please bring someone with you.

How to choose your test:

• Introductory level:

This level introduces the rider/horse to the sport of dressage.

This test asks for horses to be ridden freely forward in a steady tempo, clear rhythm, and soft contact. Accuracy of transitions and geometry are considered.

Introductory Test A & B are walk/trot only, test C has a small amount of canter work.

• Training Level:

This test ask for horses to be ridden freely forward in a steady tempo, clear rhythm, and soft contact. Accuracy of transitions and geometry are considered. Great level if your horse can show a fairly balanced 20 metre circle in canter.

First Level:

In addition to the requirements of Training Level, First Level tests ask for trot lengthening (thrust) and leg yield (lateral suppleness).

• Second Level:

All the above requirements, plus the beginning of collection, uphill tendency. Movements and transitions include medium gaits, shoulder in, turn on the haunches.
