Carol Papworth

The perfect spot was accessible only after fording 3 creeks and is surrounded by Crown land. They started family life in a trailer and then moved into a Lindel cedar cabin. As the family grew, the cedar from the cabin was used for the interior of a more spacious log home. After her Dad passed away, Carol's mom, an avid quilter and sewer, stayed on the property until age 85. When her Mom was left stranded after the 2005 floods took out the access bridges, Carol and husband Joe swapped homes with Mom. A true local gal, Carol was inspired by Patty's vision for the Kids Only Shoppe and she is the first official KOS elf. She is a tireless supporter of the KOS.

Carol has many hobbies including riding – she has 5 horses now. Other interests are running, swimming, downhill skiing, sailing, wind surfing and ukulele. She and Joe take an annual trip to any place that has good wind surfing – lakes and oceans – favourites are Oregon, Baja, Aruba, Hawaii to name a few. In her younger days, she took a 3 year, round the world adventure that included Europe, South Africa, SE Asia, Iran, Afghanistan, India, Australia to work then South America for a year. No surprise that this water baby worked as

a lifeguard while growing up.

When asked about her favourite destination, she finds it hard to answer. The exposure to so many cultures helps her to appreciate how those cultures survive and gives great perspective on the value of home. When at home she has the radio on all the time, tuned to music from the 1970s and 80s.
