Happy trails, and I hope to cross paths with many of you soon!

































#### Biographies of Priddis and Millarville Fair Donors

#### John & Ida Jackson - Trophy for Best Vegetable Collection 2007-



John and Ida Jackson were married in 1934 and took over the William Jackson Homestead (1896), north of the Race Track. John and his friends Lloyd Standish, Art Patterson and Bob Winthrop cut logs with 2-man Swede saws in the summers of 1946-1948 to build the Race Track Hall. They cut the lumber on John Jackson's and Royal Burrows' sawmills, and built the Racetrack hall with the neighbours and carpenter Harold Biswanger in 1949-50.

John and Ida and their boys Walter and Bill maintained a huge garden of fruits and vegetables. Ida was an avid volunteer for the Fair for several decades, helping with the Fair Book and concession, and other projects.

#### Art and Theresa Patterson - Featured Flower Arrangement Trophy 1981-

Art and Theresa Patterson were married in 1941 and took over the Frank Patterson Homestead (1902). They delighted in their gardens and landscaping, growing flowers, shrubs, rows of trees, enormous vegetable gardens and rows of raspberries. Art and Theresa both took their share of leadership in the community, at the Races, the Fair, and Christ Church Millarville, the Hort Club, and hosted organizational meetings to bring power, telephone and gas into the area.

The 6th generation of Pattersons still reside at the homestead NE of the Race Track.



#### Myrna McKay - Best Photograph in Adult & Jr. Photograph - 2019-



Myrna grew up a mile west of Red Deer Lake, and became one of the community's best volunteer. Myrna would move in and run the campground at the Track all summer, tending to the needs of the campers.

With her endless energy, Myrna would show up at the church the day before the Flower Festival, and scrub all the gravestones with soap and water.

Myrna had a passion for travel and photography and became the Director of the Photography section at the Priddis & Millarville Fair for many years. Hence this trophy for Best Photograph at the Fair has been donated by Lindsay, John, & Eloise Francis and her grandmother Bea McKay. Combined with her being the owner of Millie the Massey at the MRAS her memory is honoured with the trophy for Best Photograph at the Fair - topped with a tractor.

#### Ross Sanderson - Best Standard Fowl - 1979 -

Ross Sanderson and wife Joyce and family lived on their farm between Red Deer Lake and Midnapore. Their specialty was raising fancy chickens of all kinds, who could sometimes be found picking bugs in the Sandersons' bountiful garden.

This trophy was donated by Mountain View Farm.



#### Tiny Springs Farm Champion Waterfowl Trophy -1974 -



Nels and Ruth Hoy ran a big Holstein dairy operation on a beautiful property just east of the Race Track. Nels also raised ducks, and their legendary duck eggs found their way into daughter Patty's prizewinning pies and cakes. Nels and Ruth's grandchildren continue the fine farm traditions at Tiny Springs Farm.

#### Bill Jackson - World Rooster Crowing Contest 2014-

Bill Jackson, also known as Mr. Millarville, is kind of an icon around here. Bill started volunteering at the Race Track when he was 6 years old, and now in his 80s, he hasn't quit yet! Bill Jackson and Bill Winthrop manned the announcers stand since the 1960s, telling the crowd who won the apple pie, the gladiolas, the best rabbits, horses, cows and sheep, pigeons and fancy chickens.

Bill also initiated and hosts the World Rooster Crowing Contest and our super fundraiser, the famous Pie Auction started in 2007, both crowdpleasers at the Fair.

#### Gord and Brenda Cherry- Best Bird in Junior Show - 2000-



Gord and Brenda and their sons Elliott Mansell and Graeme delighted in showing their beloved birds at the Fair for many years, and also of course the World Rooster Crowing Contest.

Fred Stroman, the long-time poultry judge, sponsored the Best Bird in Junior Show Trophy. When Fred retired, the Cherry family took over the trophy.

#### Murray Jackson - Trophy for the Best Gladiolus Display - 2008 -

Murray Jackson grew up west of Millarville, son of William and Esther Jackson. Murray was a mechanical guy who drove a cat and built roads in the area for many years. But he and lona surprised everyone with their bountiful flowers and vegetables. Their special touch made their gardens thrive in the sometimes frosty Chinook zone. They especially loved showing their vegetables and their prizewinning gladiolas at the Fair.



#### Christine Drake - Award of Excellence for Adult Arts & Handicrafts - 2022-



Christine lives in Calgary, but her heart is deep in the foothills. She is usually busy creating and teaching her many arts and crafts. And she loves to travel.

#### Mac and Helen Bamford - Pen of Market Lambs Trophy - 2008 -

Mac and Helen were well-loved community members at Red Deer Lake and the larger Millarville community. They ran a huge dairy barn as well as their beloved sheep.

Mac and Helen raised their 4 children and helped shepherd the 4H Beef Club and the 4H Food Club.



#### Tom Davenport - Trophy for Best Sweet Peas 2000 -



Tom Davenport lived on his farm SW of Priddis. A community man, he was Councillor for MD Foothills for many years. Tom brought special Sweet Peas from England, and showed his wonderful specimens at the Fair for many years, to the envy of all.

Tom was glad to share his secrets with anyone that wanted to grow Sweet Peas.

#### Outstanding Exhibitor/Contributor Award - 1996 -



Patty Webb and other passionate fair volunteers recognized the need to celebrate the many volunteers and exhibitors who have taken the initiative to become involved in the ongoing success and promotion of the P & M Fair through exhibiting, providing leadership, and volunteering, making a significant impact on the success of the Fair.

Deserving individuals of all ages receive a plaque and have their names added to the permanent display in the Race Track Hall. Recipients receive an individual plaque as well.

The MRAS riding rules, and sign-up sheet have been developed to help our members have a safe and enjoyable time riding while also maintaining our building in good condition.

<u>Riding Rules:</u> These have been created and agreed upon to ensure everyone using the facility remains safe and that our facility can be kept in great condition. Please continue to follow the rules and encourage your fellow riders to follow the rules. <u>Booking Sheet:</u> Please use the booking sheet when you plan to ride and honor your time. This practice is in place to ensure fair usage of the facility and helps the maintenance team plan when they can be in the arena for maintenance.

Manure: Please continue to clean up after your horses. We know the vast majority of you are excellent at this, but it continues to be a problem.

#### \*\*LEAVE IT BETTER THAN HOW YOU FOUND IT\*\*

Please respect all riders and clean up after every ride. Sweep the mats, put things back where they belong, dispose of your horse's manure from the arena and parking lot using the forks and transport it to the <u>BLUE BINS</u> (not the garbage can).
