



The 2025 Priddis & Millarville Fair was a resounding success, marked by record-breaking attendance and a wonderful experience of community spirit! The weekend had excellent weather.





The Fair was a true intergenerational affair, with both young and old immersing themselves in the experience of exhibiting, volunteering, and attending the Fair.

- 6000 guests on Saturday and 3800 on Sunday (record attendance on both days)
- 1787 ribbons were awarded to celebrate the talents of our 555 exhibitors and competitors
- 367 participants received prize payouts. 27 received over \$100
- The youngest exhibitors were 2 years old. The oldest exhibitor age disclosed at registration was 94.

## The Farmerettes of Sunny Slope Ranch

Miss Peter Webber, an English woman, with her companion, Ms. Cullette (Weaver) Gopel, an American divorcee, bought the S 1/2 of Section 31 and the E 1/2 of Section 30 Twp 22 R2 W5 in early 1924. This land is located 1.6 kms east of the junction of Hwy #22 and Hwy 22X on the north side of the highway. They were the first women locally to run a farm and operate machinery along with the men so they were dubbed the Farmerettes. Miss Webber was not her real name as she was the daughter of a well to do London, England member of Parliament. What was learned was she was an expert driver, a good shot, and extremely venturesome and that she had worked for the British Government in Turkey and India. During the war she is supposed to have driven an ambulance in Serbia.


Also, as an author she wrote "The Gilt on the Gingerbread" while on the ranch. (I researched this book and found one book published anonymously in

1925 by Williams and Norgate, London, England. The forward to the book was written by W.L. George a British journalist who wrote several novels and short stories. The book presents an autobiographical "low life" narrative of a "girl wretched from birth" in England.) I cannot help but assume that this book is in fact the one written by the mysterious Miss Webber.

The farmerettes put three hundred acres in crop and when they hit the first good crop Miss Webber went to Calgary and bought a new Fordson tractor and Sawyer-Massey grain separator. To bring it home, she drove the outfit along 9th Avenue to 1st Street East and then west on 8th Avenue to John Irwin's Grocery where a large order (of groceries) was put in the blower. Joe Grisedale, an Englishman who worked briefly for Miss Webber, rode on the back of the outfit all the way. Tractors at the time all had steel wheels and lugs so they were forbidden on Calgary pavement but no one stopped them. This is probably the first and only time a tractor and separator moved along Calgary's 8th Avenue. They finished the trip in the dark by the headlights of a truck. Sometime later, Miss Webber abruptly left for England but returned again and was thought to have lived for a while on the Walker Ranch (West ½ Section 12, Twp 22 R2 W5), Pine Creek area.

Meanwhile, in the fall of 1926, Cullette Gopel married Major Bernard Francis (Bumpy) Rhodes, a wealthy Englishmen who held a commission in the British Army in World War I. Bumpy owned the Minnehaha Ranch in Grand Valley near Cochrane. Bumpy and Cullette adopted a son David. About 1930 they moved to Victoria and bought a mansion. Bumpy died at the young age of 47 on June 19th, 1935 at Victoria. Shortly after Bumpy died, Cullette and David left Victoria and moved back to the ranch at Cochrane. David attended Brentwood College on Vancouver Island but spent his vacations at the ranch.

In the late 1930s Cullette went to Tahiti on a vacation and while she was there, she bought a coconut plantation at Papeete, the capital of French Polynesia. Two of her companions Eric Hanner who she had married, and Count von Luckner, (Check out this link for an interesting story of Count von Luckner). Both men were German citizens so the French government revoked Cullette's visa and she had to leave Tahiti. Undaunted, Cullette bought a 50-foot two-masted schooner, the Valkyrie, and she and David, with Eric Hanner as captain and two Tahitian sailors as crew, sailed for Honolulu.



At some point, Cullette met Margot DeCarie, who had been Amelia Earhart's secretary and an admirer of the famous aviator. Cullette, Eric, Margot and David cruised the Pacific Ocean stopping at many small islands in hopes of finding Amelia who had disappeared July 2nd, 1937 when she and attempted to be the first woman pilot to circumnavigate the globe accompanied by her navigator Fred Noonan. (In 1971 Margot DeCarie donated over 60 photographs of Amelia Earhart to the International Women's Air and Space Museum). When they reached Honolulu, Cullette had her marriage to Eric Hanner dissolved. She and her son David returned once again to the ranch at Cochrane. David Rhodes managed the Minnehahah Ranch for a while and then joined the Lord Strathcona Horse. He later transferred to the U.S. Army and served in World War II. After David went off to war, Cullette assumed her old name and ran the ranch herself for a while. The ranch was sold in 1947 to Jack Bolton and Cullette moved to Santa Monica, California. The ranch is now called the Anchor X and is owned by Jim Burns.

Death records reveal Cullette's name as Ethel Zora Weaver Rhodes who was born in Oregon on April 6th, 1892, daughter of Hezekiah W. Weaver and Francis Elizabeth (McConnell) Weaver. She passed away on November 15th, 1952 at age 60 and is interred in Evansburg, Indiana. At the time of her death, Cullette was survived by her son Lt. David A. Rhodes of the US Army.

Unfortunately, I could find no further information could be found on Miss Peter Webber and so she remains anonymous.

November 14, 1938 - July 17, 2025

David was a third-generation rancher of the original homestead established in 1897 by his grandfather. He was a second-generation volunteer at the Millarville Racing and Agricultural Society, contributing as MRAS Director, Patrol Judge at the Races, and Fair Director. In the 1960's, David raised purebred Appaloosa horses and purebred Charolais cattle and showed these at the Priddis & Millarville Fair. David became a Millarville Racing & Agricultural Life Member in 2004. Our condolences to the family. A celebration of life will be held at a later date.

The change of seasons is evocative. Whether it's the smell of pumpkin pies baking or the sharp clear Alberta blue sky in contrast with crisp yellow aspen leaves something signals that fall has arrived. Please respect all riders and clean up after every ride. Sweep the mats, put things back where they belong, dispose of your horse's manure from the arena and parking lot using the forks and transport it to the <u>BLUE BINS</u> (not the garbage can).




